CM Tweets About Back-To-Back Rises In MRP Of Fuel, Other Essentials

Kolkata: Chief minister Mamata Banerjee on Saturday lashed out at the Narendra Modi government, telling it to "immediately stop tormenting" people with hikes in the prices of fuel and essential commodities.

Banerjee tweeted: "The Union government must immediately stop tormenting the people of India. By repeatedly increasing #fuel prices, #LPG prices & prices of #essentialcommodities, @BJPIndia is actually conducting #GreatIndianLoot. People are being fooled. Sad to see the media silent and blind."

Trinamool Congress MP and spokesperson Sukhendu Sekhar Ray said: "Retail and wholesale price inflation have touched new highs. And in this backdrop, they are also increasing prices which directly impact common people. The so-called economic reforms now need to be reformed. The price rise needs to be rolled back.

"Even commercial LPG prices have been spiked. It has increased to Rs 351.50 for a 19-kg cylinder. These are used by industries and restaurants and will have a cascading effect on everyone's lives," Ray added.

"Last May, petrol price in Kolkata was Rs 91.41/l, today it is Rs 115.12. The diesel price is Rs 99.83. Since May, the prices of essential drugs have also been increased. I will just cite the example of one drug paracetamol - which is used by everyone. It used to cost Rs 18 in 2019 March, now you will have to buy it for Rs 35.5," the TMC MP said.

Ray added: "When CM Banerjee flagged the fuel price rise issue as anti-people and demanded its rollback, we heard the PM blame oppositiongoverned states, including Bengal, for not scaling down taxes. For petrol, the central

Amid all these inflationary trends, the RBI hiking the repo rate was an unprecedented move, Ray said. "This couldn't have come at a worse time. Retail inflation is at a 17month high of 7.4% in April and wholesale inflation has touched 14.5%. This is more severe than the economic depression."

Modi removing all safety nets for common man: Rahul

New Delhi: The fresh hike in prices of domestic LPG cylinders had the opposition parties on the boil on Saturday with Congress, Trinamool Congress, CPM and CPI each slamming the government over the 'anti-people move".

Congress leader Rahul Gandhi accused the Modi government of removing all "safety nets" that his party had put in place to protect the common man. Congress would have never allowed such a thing,

"During the Congress-led UPA govt, the price of a LPG cylinder was Rs 414. A subsidy of Rs 827 was being given on every cylinder. Today, the cost of a cylinder is Rs 999. The amount of subsidy given is 'zero' ... Millions of Indian households are waging a difficult battle against extreme inflation, unemployment, and poor governance," Rahul said on Facebook.

Congress tions chief Randeep Surjewala and spokesperson Pawan Khera also demanded a rollback of the Rs 50 hike. Khera garlanded two gas cylinders and lit incense sticks in front of vegetables at the Congress headquarters, calling the party press conference a "condolence meeting for the gas

CPM general secretary Sitaram Yechury said the hike was a part of the "relentless assaults" launched by the Modi government on people's livelihoods. Healso said the Modigovernment is the "most inhuman and callous government" in 75 years of Independent India. CPI chief D Raja said the repo rate hike by RBI will lead companies to charge more for products on the back of costlier inputs.

"The government remains insensitive to people's suffering but is continuously helping corporate houses to fill their kitties," Raja said, urging opposition forces to protest the anti-people move.

On April 22, an SC bench headed by Justice AM Khanwilkar had taken strong exception to a Delhi Police affidavit, filed by Southeast Delhi deputy commissioner of police Esha Pandey that said police have closed investigations into complaints alleging hate speech at the event organised by Hindu Yuva Vahini at Banarasidas Chandiwala Auditorium, near Govindpuri Metro Station, on December 19.

In a fresh affidavit, DCP Pandey stated that "after further minute verification of the material, a fresh FIR at Okhla Industrial Area police station for offences un der Section 153A (promoting enmity between different groups), 295A (deliberate acts to outrage religious sentiments), 298 (hurting religious sentiments through spoken words) and 34 (common intention to commit the offence) of the IPC'

Delhi court issues bailable warrant against Abhishek wife

Kolkata: Days before the Supreme Court hears the pleas of Trinamool Congress national general secretary Abhishek Banerjee and his wife Rujira against the Enforcement Directorate's summonses, asking them to appear before it in Delhi, Patiala House Court on Saturday issued a bailable warrant against Rujira.

According to sources, their pleas are listed for hearing in the apex court on May 12 while the bailable warrant seeks Rujira's appearance by August 20.

The developments are linked to the ED's ongoing probe into illegal coal mining in Bengal. A lawyer, acquainted with the case, said: "We are aware of the bailable warrant issued. Appropriate legal steps will be taken depending on the SC hearing."

Abhishek has twice appeared before the ED in Delhi. But, Rujira has repeatedly asked the agency's officials to question her in Kolkata, expressing her inability to stay away from their minor child for the long duration that travelling to Delhi would involve.

Sources indicated that the ED had informed the court about Rujira's non-appearance at the agency's office, which, it argued, was coming in the way of the probe.

'For sedition law relook, it must be referred to a larger bench'

New Delhi: Batting for retention of the sedition law (Section 124A of IPC) in a written submission in Supreme Court, the Centre said the 1962 SC judgment in the Kedar Nath Singh case had considered its constitutional validity from all possible angles.

Solicitor general Tushar Mehta said should the court decide to re-examine the provision, it must be done by a larger bench and not a threejudge bench.

Countering the allegation that the provision was brought in by the colonial masters and has lost its relevance in an independent country, Mehta said Kedar Nath Singh case was decided post-Independence and the case was decided with a clear backdrop and experience of how Section 124A used to

ce and the apex court had consciously read down the

Mehta said that misuse of

the provision, as alleged by the petitioners, could never be a ground to strike it down and the remedy would lie in preventing its abuse. "The saidjudgment in Kedar Nath Singh case is a good law and needs no reconsideration. It must be treated as binding precedent requiring no reference. A holistic reading of the judgment clearly reveals that the Constitution Bench considered the constitutional validity of Section 124A from the perspective of all constitutional principles, including the test of Articles 14, 19, 21. Merely because Article 14 and 21 are not mentioned, would not undermine its final judicial conclusion. The five-judge bench read down Section 124A only to bring it in conformity with

Constitution. No reference, therefore, would be necessary nor can the three-judge bench once again examine the constitutional validity of the very same provision," the SG said in his submission.

Though the written submission has been filed on the issue of reference and the Centre is vet to file an affidavit which it will have to do on Monday as directed by the SC, the submission makes the Centre's stand clear that it is against scrapping of the sedition law, a stand similar to what attorney general KK Venugopal took days before in court and batted for retention of the controversial provision in the law book.
