65 new Covid-19 cases, one death in Uttarakhand

The state Health department reported 65 new patients of Covid-19 and death of one patient from the disease in Uttarakhand on Wednesday.

The health department reported 22 new patients from Dehradun, 10 from Champawat and six from Haridwar on Wednesday.

The department has so far detected 91,462 new cases of the disease from January 1 this year till date. A total of 87,145 patients have recovered from the disease so far in this year while 266 patients have died in the state since January 1 this year.

The active case count of Covid-19 in the state is now at 859. Dehradun with 319 cases is at the top of the table of active cases while Pauri has 121 active cases of the disease.

NAPSR writes to SCPCR to ensure safety of students in school buses

The National Association for Parents and Students Rights (NAPSR) has written a letter to the State Commission for Protection of Child Rights (SCPCR) to ensure the implementation of guidelines issued by the Supreme Court (SC) for the safety of students in school buses.

In order to avoid recurrence of such accident in future, NAPSR has appealed to SCPCR to issue orders to the authorities concerned to conduct proper investigation under the Protection of Child Rights Act and to check the arbitrariness of schools as well as to the departments concerned to implement the guidelines of the Supreme Court.
